# Personal Coat of Arms

The Coat of Arms started in about the 12<sup>th</sup> Century. A knight dressed in armor from head to foot could not be recognized by friends or enemies. This resulted in markings being painted on knights' shields, as it was the largest piece of equipment the knight had and as the shield was easily seen from far away. The symbols used on coats of arms were chosen carefully to represent an individual or an entire family. The study of the symbols, colors, and patterns used in Coats of Arms is known as heraldry.
